The group started out as 3 people and has grown to over 25 and is continuing to grow with each year. Most of the people who come in has a real desire to stop their drinking and/or drugging. There are some tools that we encourage people to pick up. . .

- Regular attendance to an AA Group
- Prayer and Turning it Over to a Higher Power
- Working the 12 Steps with a sponsor
- Staying sober One day at a time
- Talk and reach out to another sober person
- Being willing to take the program wherever possible to others who are suffering with the disease of alcohol and addiction.
- Reading the Big Book of AA or other materials sanctioned by AA as a whole

Many of the new persons coming in do not have the funds to purchase the needed materials to stay sober. 
